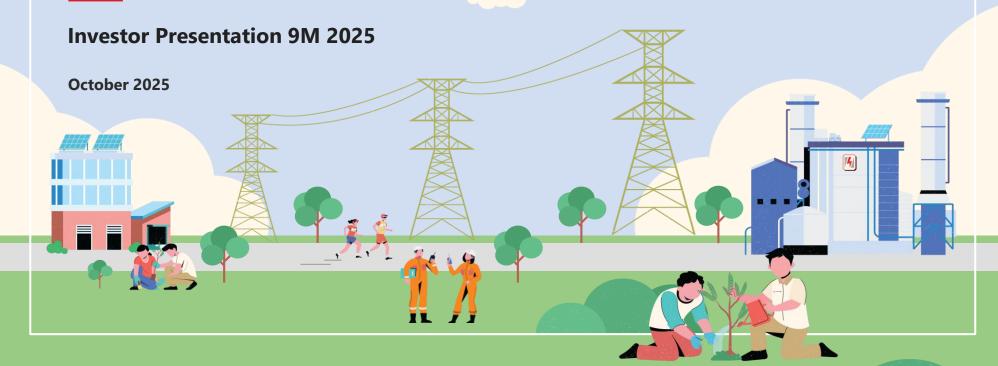

#### **Company Overview**

#### **Overview**

- > Longest operating private power producer in Indonesia since 1993
- > Serves industrial customers in one of the largest, most developed, and integrated industrial estate (IE) area in Indonesia
- Integrated IUPTLU<sup>1</sup> license provides exclusivity to supply power to Industrial Customers within its designated area
- > Total installed generating capacity of 1,144 MW + 41.4 MWp
  - > 864 MW Gas -fired Power Plant<sup>2</sup>
  - > 280 MW Steam Power Plant, of which 70 MW of biomass co-firing capacity<sup>3</sup>
  - > 41.4 MWp Solar Power, with another 13.2 MWp in progress
- > First PPU<sup>4</sup> listed in IDX [POWR:IJ]
- > Since its IPO (2016-2024), the Company has consistently delivered a robust average dividend yield<sup>5</sup> of 9.1% and strong average ROE of 13.3%
- The Company's dividend yield ranks within the Top 30 on the IDX<sup>6</sup>
- > Repeat debt issuer in international debt market listed on Singapore Exchange (SGX) (2010, 2012, 2016, and 2025)
- > Coupon: 5.65% p.a.
- > Tenor: 10 years (until 2035)
- > S&P / Moody's credit rating of BBB- (Stable) / Baa3 (Stable). The Company's debt ratings are now classified as Investment Grade
- Cikarang Listrindo's debt rating ranks in the top 3 and top 6 of Indonesia's private non-bank companies covered by S&P and Moody's, respectively

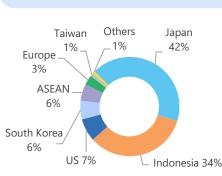

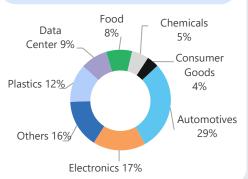

#### Share of KWH Sold by Industry

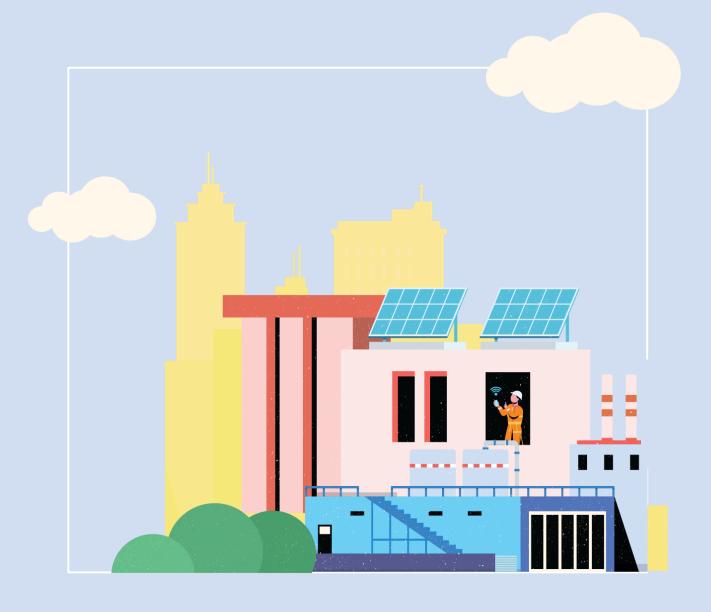

#### **Update on Company's Expansion Projects**

#### **Biomass Co-firing**



- 2021 Installed biomass handling system in PLTU Babelan, allowing biomass utilization for up to 28 MW of capacity generation
- > **1H25** Expanded biomass co-firing capacity by up to 70 MW of capacity generation
- 9M25 Scaled up co-firing PLTU initiative increasing utilization of biomass by 284.5% from 37.0 kTon in 9M24 to 142.5 kTon in 9M25
- 2026 As part of our ongoing commitment, we will gradually increase the utilization of biomass, supporting our transition toward cleaner and more sustainable energy sources.

#### **Gas Engine**



- The Company has started to construct a gas engine power plant project with the capacity of 50 MW to increase operational performance
- 9M25 Gas engine power plant project has reached 70% completed.
- 2026 An additional 50 MW is scheduled for commissioning in the first half of 2026, which will increase our power plant capacity

#### **Solar Power**



- > 2018 Installed 52.5 kWp solar power at Jababeka office
- 2019 Started providing customers with solar power as a renewable energy source
- 2024 Started a 5 MWp ground-mounted solar power at its operational office in Babelan. The project is currently in progress
- > 9M25 Expanded solar power capacity to 41.4 MWp (2024: 35.8 MWp), with another 13.2 MWp in progress, bringing total capacity to 54.6 MWp by end of 2025
- > **2026** An additional 15 MWp of solar power capacity will be added in 2026

#### **Disclosure of Information**

On August 14, 2025, the Company made a public disclosure regarding a disruption in its gas supply For the first time in 32+ years, we faced two 2 unprecedented events occurring at the same time. Yet, we mitigated major risks and ensuring continued reliable operations



#### **Details of Event**

Aug 5, 2025

Unplanned shutdown at PT Pertamina EP ("PEP") Subang Field temporarily affected gas supply to all PEP Western Java customers, including the Company

Aug 13, 2025

PT Perusahaan Gas Negara ("PGN") reported pressure issues in South Sumatera West Java ("SSWJ") network, potentially impacting gas supply to our power plant

Sep 30, 2025

- Gas supply status summary
- ✓ PEP : Since the incident up to Sep 30, the average gas supply from PEP was 13 BBTUD
- ✓ PGN: Gas supply has recovered starting Aug 18, 2025, reaching to average gas supply before the incident

#### **Next Step Taken**

our long-term resilience

- We are actively exploring alternative natural gas up to 30 BBTUD from various suppliers, including LNG options, to alleviate gas supply issues Additionally, we have successfully secured an extra 6 MMSCFD of gas from Akasia Bagus, scheduled to begin by the end of 2025. This new supply will further enhance our supply chain stability and strengthen
- We have initiated an insurance claim to cover the additional costs incurred due to this event. We're currently in discussions with our insurer

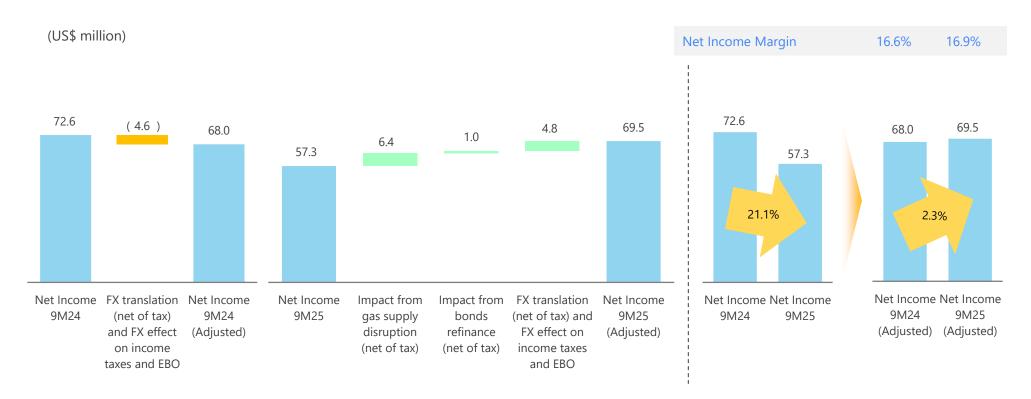

- The historical dividend payout is above the dividend payout communicated during IPO of 60%
- Management is **committed to distribute a regular dividend** (interim and final dividend) with careful consideration to the Company's cash flow
- > Throughout the years 2016 to 2024, POWR has consistently delivered a robust average dividend yield of 9.1%

- > The Company's dividend yield ranks within the **Top 30 on the IDX**<sup>3</sup>
- > POWR's dividend yield is also greater than average Thai's power companies' dividend yield<sup>4</sup> of 3.8%, MSCI World Utilities<sup>5</sup> of 3.3%, and MSCI Emerging Market<sup>5</sup> of 2.4%
- The Company's average ROE for 2016-2024 of 13.3% is higher compared to average Thai's power companies of 7.3%
- > POWR is included in the ESG Quality 45 IDX KEHATI<sup>6</sup> and Indonesia Sharia Stock Index<sup>7</sup>



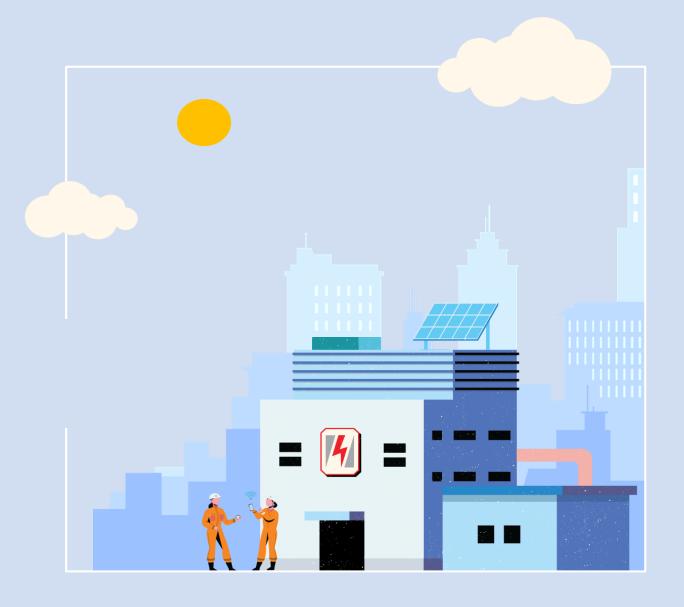

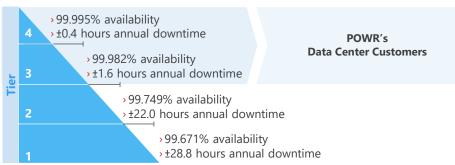

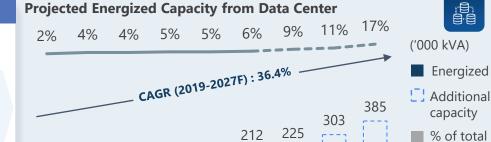
